Our Center provides numerous exercise classes, games, artistic endeavors and programs for seniors to strengthen their minds and bodies to maintain their independence. For the next 2-3 months, I will attempt to visit or participate in all regular physical therapy students from Andrews classes and share my experiences.

Resistive Exercise - Instructor: Rocco Pavese This class focuses on full body strengthening. It is offered several times a week. The day I attended, there were 43 people in attendance. I knew I had a workout at the end of the 45 minutes. I will be returning to this class.
