TRIPS



The Center arranges several trips each year, 3 overnight trips and 10-12 day trips. Now is the time to provide your suggestions for the 2024 schedule. There is a box near the greeter's desk to deposit your suggestions. Keep in

mind the Center's rules for overnight trips: they consist of two Diamond Tour trips and one to Mackinac Island. See the map above the suggestion box for the list of available Diamond Tour trips. We only travel in the USA! The rule for a day trip is a bus ride that should be 3 hours or less one way.

Each trip has a degree of activity.

MODERATE: On/off bus once (walkers, canes and assisted walking permitted)

ACTIVE: On/off bus 2 or more times, some walking, may need a companion for walking assistance.

VERY ACTIVE: On/off bus numerous times, LOTS of walking - **NO WALKERS OR CANES PERMITTED.**

This is very important for the overnight trips since many consist of walking tours with a guide. If you question your ability or want more information regarding a scheduled trip, please talk to our Program Coordinator, Jennifer Malone.

Over the last 8-9 years, I have gone on several of our day and overnight trips. It is exciting to go to new places and experience the history of our great nation. My favorite was the Washington DC trip.

There are numerous advantages for going on a Center's trip. You get to know your fellow passengers and many people have made lasting friendships. The biggest advantage is leaving the driving to a professional!

WOOD SHOP INFORMATION

As many of you know, our wonderful Wood Shop is now open. Below is some general information about how our Wood Shop operates. For more details please call or stop at the front desk.

CURRENT HOURS/DAYS OF OPERATION Monday through Friday 9:00 am-3:00 pm

To use the Wood Shop, you must be a current member of SILSSC and make an appointment to sign up for a mandatory Safety Orientation Class, which are Wednesdays only, to become a Wood Shop member. You can make an appointment for orientation at the front desk, which is approximately 3 hours. You need to sign up 2 business days in advance to attend a orientation. Everyone will pay \$20 to take the orientation. This fee will include a 1-month membership, which will start on the 1st business day after the orientation. Also our real need is for Halloween and included for this price is a project, which will Thanksgiving cards. Also, we are in need of include all materials to be completed during light pink, beige, blue, and lavender your first month. Safety glasses are mandatory. envelopes. We do not need any Christmas If you do not have a pair, you can purchase them cards at this time, thank you. We cannot at the front desk; \$2 for regular safety glasses and \$5 for glasses that fit over a prescription.

Please call ahead if you need loan To use the Wood Shop after orientation, you need to have an active Wood Shop membership and sign all membership documents. All fees are to be paid at the front desk before you can use the Wood Shop.

Wood Shop Member Payment Plans

- \$5 daily fee
- \$20 monthly fee or \$10 if paid 16th-end of the month (this pro-rated fee only applies the first time you use the Wood Shop. After initial payment, total monthly fee applies).
- \$30 monthly fee for couples or \$15 if paid on or after the 16th of the month (this pro-rated fee only applies the first time using the Wood Shop, after initial payment, total monthly fee applies).
- \$200 yearly fee or \$300 yearly fee for couples.

NO REFUNDS AFTER PAYMENT IS RECEIVED.






SILSSC GARDENS
