Not too long ago, the Center was known primarily for bingo, cards, and lunch. Today, we We are the generation that refuses to sit still in are bursting at the seams with energy, enthusiasm, and an ever-growing list of activities. Our exercise classes alone have multiplied—just In addition to our growing list of activities, we take a look at our schedule!

When the Circuit Training Room was first proposed, the big question was: Will anyone use it? Fast forward to today, and we just completed an expansion that increased its size because demand was so high. On any given day, the training room is one of the busiest parts of the Center, averaging over 100 users out of the 340 people who walk through our doors daily. The same excitement can be seen in our Wood Shop, where up to 10 people at a time are busy making pens, kitchen utensils, storage boxes, furniture, and even engraving their work with a laser. Creativity is thriving here!

Our Center has transformed into a lively hub. The parking lot is packed, and every room is filled with people engaged in a wide range of activities-Pickleball, Line Dancing, Zumba, several different card games, Book Club, Golf and Softball Leagues, crafting, Ukulele classes, Outdoor Fitness Zone, paved and unpaved Walking Trails thru gardens and woods, multiple diverse exercise classes and even a newly formed Choir.

We are also inspired by members like Bill Riekels, who well into his 90s was still bicycling to the Center and using the weight room. Stories like his remind us that age is just a number! With over 9,000 members and nearly 100 new signups each month, we continue to grow beyond what we ever imagined. Looking ahead, we may need to seriously consider expanding our

building, parking lot, or even adding another outdoor pavilion.

Of course, such growth requires funding. Our current county mileage barely covers operating costs, and without our generous donors, we wouldn't be where we are today. We are incredibly grateful for their support and hope to continue building a future that matches our community's energy and ambition.

- WOLUNTEERS Please remember to sign in on the monitor as Volunteering and record your volunteer hours so you are accounted for on our daily number of people in our building.
- Please call ahead if you need loan equipment.
- We are in need of sympathy cards. Also, birthday cards for: daughter, daughter-in-law, son, son-in-law, granddaughter, grandson, niece, and by age (but we do not need any for 80 years of age). No Christmas cards at this time.
- Class descriptions are available at the front desk, on our website and on the bulletin board by the gym entrance.
- To be eligible to use the services at our Senior Center, <u>you or your spouse</u> need to be 60 years of age or older. You need to be in our service area to use our transportation, run for our Board of Directors and/or vote in our Annual Board Election.

CURRENT HOURS/DAYS OF OPERATION Monday-Friday 9:00 am-3:00 pm

To use the Wood Shop, you must be a current member of SJLSSC and make an appointment to sign up for a mandatory Safety Orientation Class, which are on Wednesdays only. You can make an appointment for orientation at the front desk, which is approximately 3 hours. You need to sign up 2 business days in advance to attend an orientation. The cost of our Wood Shop orientation is \$20. This fee will include a 1month membership, which will start on the 1st business day after the orientation. Also included for this price is a project, which will include all materials to be completed during your first month. Safety glasses are mandatory. If you do not have a pair, you can purchase them at the front desk; \$2 for regular safety glasses and \$5 for glasses that fit over a prescription.

To use the Wood Shop after orientation, you need to have an active Wood Shop membership and sign all membership documents. All fees are to be paid at the front desk before you can use the Wood Shop.
