#### NEW MEMBERS - CIRCUIT TRAINING ROOM

The phrase, "The most difficult exercise is walking through the door, the rest is easy," is often attributed to various fitness experts and motivational speakers, emphasizing the challenge of starting a workout routine. It highlights the importance of overcoming initial barriers to exercise. Senior Center members, if you want to use the Cardio, CTR, and Free Weight rooms, stop by in person and request the required free 30 minute orientation. During your scheduled appointment, an exercise trainer will show you how to use our equipment safely and effectively. You must be a member of our Senior Center. The training room is open 9:00 am-3:00 pm, Monday through Friday. Check in on the hallway monitor before your appointment and each time you use this room. We look forward to seeing you.

#### FREE WEIGHT ROOM

The addition of our Free Weight Room to our facility has opened up a whole new way of exercising at our Center where it isn't necessary to take an hour class to achieve results, as long as you perform your work out on a continuous basis. Below is the new equipment available and the benefits that each piece can provide to our members.

Dumbbells, Medicine Balls, and Kettlebell **Training:** Can reverse age-related muscle loss, improve osteoarthritis, bone health, and improve cardiovascular health. It can also help maintain a healthy weight and allow you to work more muscles. Body weight training is also available.

Resistance Bands: Improves muscle strength and tone, as well as flexibility and joint mobility. Resistance bands will also enhance balance and stability, reducing the risk of falls and injuries.



True Stretch Cage: Suitable for users of all fitness levels and is designed to provide a safe, effective way to stretch a variety of muscle groups. Traditional stretching can also be achieved with mats and instructions.



#### CIRCUIT TRAINING ROOM SURVEY

The Versa Leg Extension can assist you in achieving your health benefits. It focuses on the major muscles of the upper leg. The angled seat and back pad encourage full quadriceps

contraction, while clearly marked pivot points optimize user alignment. The self-adjusting tibia pad provides comfortable support, and the back pad easily adjusts from a seated position. Remember to always ask for assistance on how to properly use any of the equipment in our Circuit Training Room.

### THE MASTER BUILDER: FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT AND THE GENIUS OF HIS ARCHITECTURE

Architect Frank Lloyd Wright designed more than 1,000 buildings, including the Fallingwater House in Pennsylvania, the Guggenheim Museum in New York City, The Rookery in Chicago, and the Howard Anthony residence in Benton Harbor. His designs were revolutionary and captivating, but his personal life was tempestuous. Join historian Tim Moore for a look at the life of this fascinating architect. 
### ALEXANDER HAMILTON: THE INFANT REPUBLIC'S ECONOMIC CZAR Monday, July 14th, 10:30 am

CURRENT HOURS/DAYS OF OPERATION Monday-Friday 9:00 am-3:00 pm

To use the Wood Shop, you must be a current member of SJLSSC and schedule an appointment for a mandatory Safety Orientation Class, which are on Wednesdays only. Orientation Classes are \$20 and last approximately three hours. Appointments can be made at the Center front desk at least two business days in advance of the class. The class fee includes a 1-month membership, which begins on the 1st business day after the orientation, as well as the materials and instruction needed for a wood shop project, to be completed during your first month. Safety glasses are mandatory. If you do not have a pair, you can purchase them at the front desk; \$2 for regular safety glasses and \$5 for glasses that fit over a prescription.

To use the Wood Shop after orientation, you need to have an active Wood Shop membership and sign all membership documents. All fees are to be paid at the front desk before you can use the Wood Shop.

### **Wood Shop Member Payment Plans**

- \$5 daily fee
- \$20 monthly fee
- \$30 monthly fee for couples
- \$200 yearly fee or \$300 yearly fee for couples.


